**Advanced Directive for Resuscitation:**

AnimalScan staff makes every effort to prevent potential complications; however, there is always some risk of a pet experiencing respiratory and/or cardiac arrest. In the rare event when a pet experiences arrest, treatment must be instituted immediately to maximize opportunity for success. Therefore, we also ask that you provide us with advanced directive as indicated below regarding attempts at resuscitation.

- Attempt Resuscitation:** This choice indicates that you authorize all efforts and procedures determined to be appropriate by the veterinarian to try to resuscitate your pet. CPR is more likely to be successful in a previously healthy, young patient and specific recommendations may be made by your veterinarian based on your pet's condition. If CPR is effective, there are often problems that need to be addressed after resuscitation. CPR does not resolve any underlying diseases. It is important that you know the cost of any additional care after the CPR are in addition to your current estimate.
- Do Not Resuscitate:** Every attempt will be made to prevent a cardiac and/or respiratory arrest from occurring, but if your animal arrests, no CPR will be performed. This option is always an acceptable choice based upon your beliefs and needs.
